



The **View** feature allows you to toggle between **Instructor View** and **Student View** in your LingroHub course. If you have edit rights to your course, you can use **Authoring Mode** to make changes to content and activities, such as creating a custom test/quiz or modifying the order of chapter/unit sections.

Being able to toggle to Student View allows you as the instructor to experience LingroHub as a student in terms of how they view the Dashboard, Content, Gradebook, and all parts of LingroHub. Below is an explanation of the main differences between Instructor View and Student View.

Dashboard

Instructor View	Student View
Shows Future assignments, how many students have submitted them, and the average score on each.	Shows Future assignments as well as Past Due assignments. Students can manually mark non-scored assignments as "Done." Shows if an instructor-graded activity is "Pending" a grade. Allows students to "Hide submitted" assignments from this list.
Quick link to View Calendar.	Quick link to View Calendar.
Assignment Actions - In "Submissions to grade," shows the number of pending submissions that need to be instructor-graded and provides a quick link to grade those assignments; In "Late Assignments," shows the number of late assignments and provides a quick link to the Late Work Manager.	Overview - Provides a quick link to the last page the student visited; shows their overall average in the course at the present moment; shows the number of Past Due Assignments

Performance - Shows a “bird's eye view” of overall class participation and performance in the LingroHub course.

Course Content - (may not be visible in the Student Dashboard for some programs) Provides quick links directly to course content.

NOTE: Course content inside each chapter/unit (e.g., readings, presentations, etc.) looks the same for instructors and students.

Activities

The main difference between the views regarding activities is that in the Instructor View you will see the answers to the assignment questions as a default. However, when you change to Student view, you will not see the answers and will be able to complete the activity as a student. This difference comes in handy when you want to project your screen to the class and complete an activity together; switching to Student View will allow you to complete the activity without displaying the correct answers.

Instructor View	Student View
<p>Has three views, Group by: Activities, Lesson, or Custom. A Custom view can be created by the instructor by Adding Custom Groups of assignments.</p>	<p>Has two possible views: Activity, where the student can view a list of all individual assignment grades, or Custom, if the instructor has set up a Custom view of the Gradebook.</p>

Instructors can view ALL students' grades (including assignment information like due date and total points available).

Instructors can adjust students' grades (along with other actions) in the Gradebook.

Students can only view their own scores for the course (including assignment information like due date and total points available).

Students can use the "Search" bar to search their gradebook to view specific assignments.
