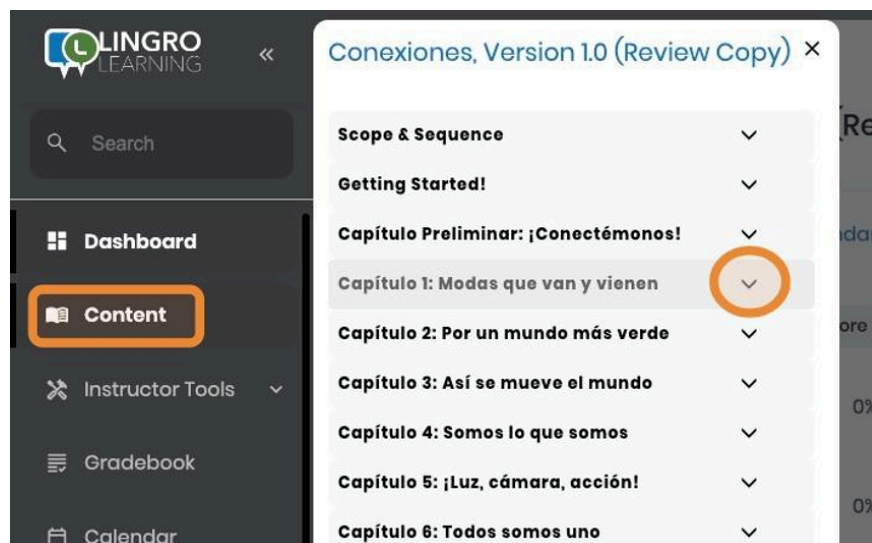


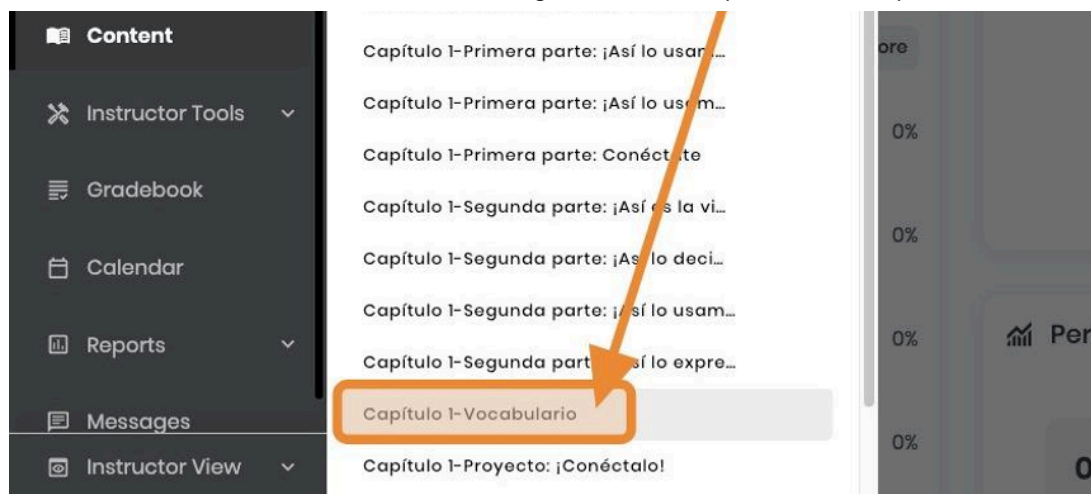
**Flashcards** are available in the **Vocabulary** section. (**NOTE:** the Vocabulary section will be located in different places within a unit depending on the language program you are using.) Below are the instructions on how to find them and best practices for how to use them.

## STEP 1: Find the Flashcards

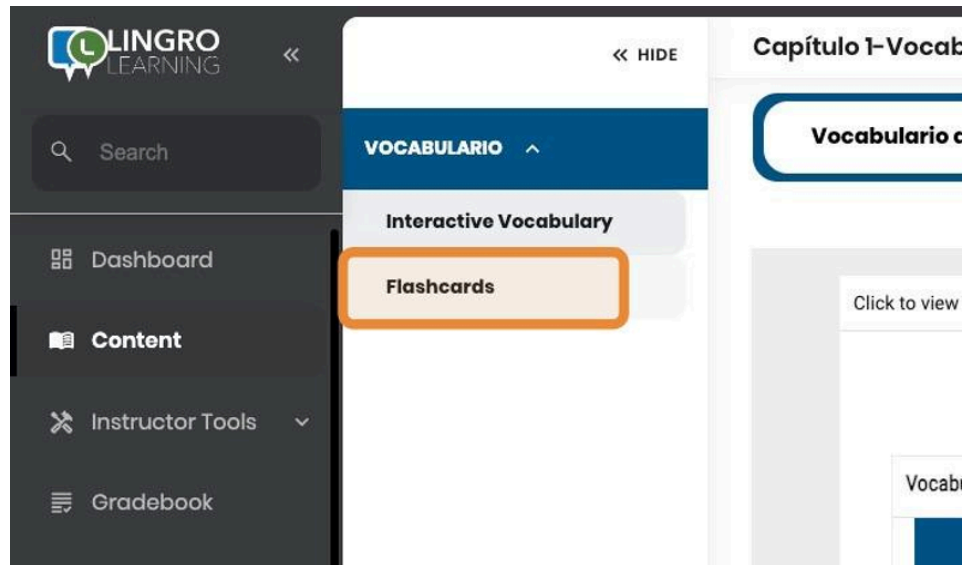
1. Click **Content** from the left navigation menu. Then **expand** the chapter you wish to view.



2. Scroll down and click on the **Vocabulary** for this chapter or unit ).



3. Click **Flashcards**.

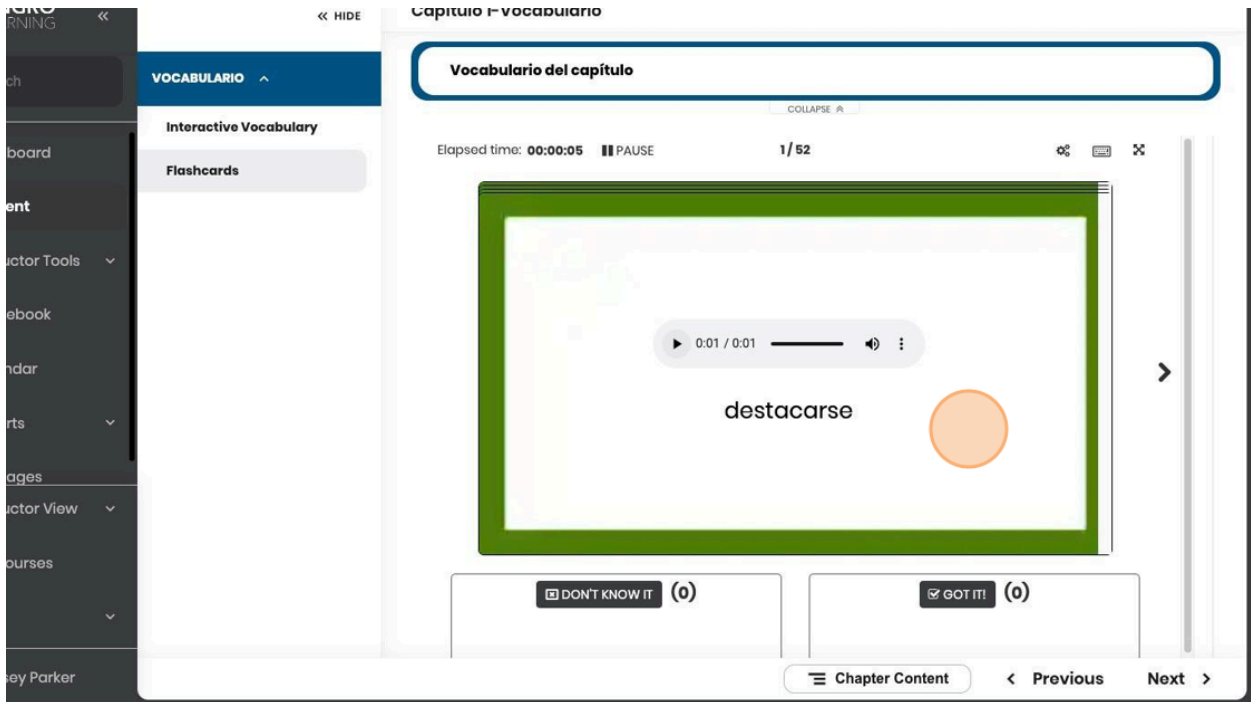


4. **Flashcards** using the entire vocabulary set from the chapter or unit have already been created for each chapter.

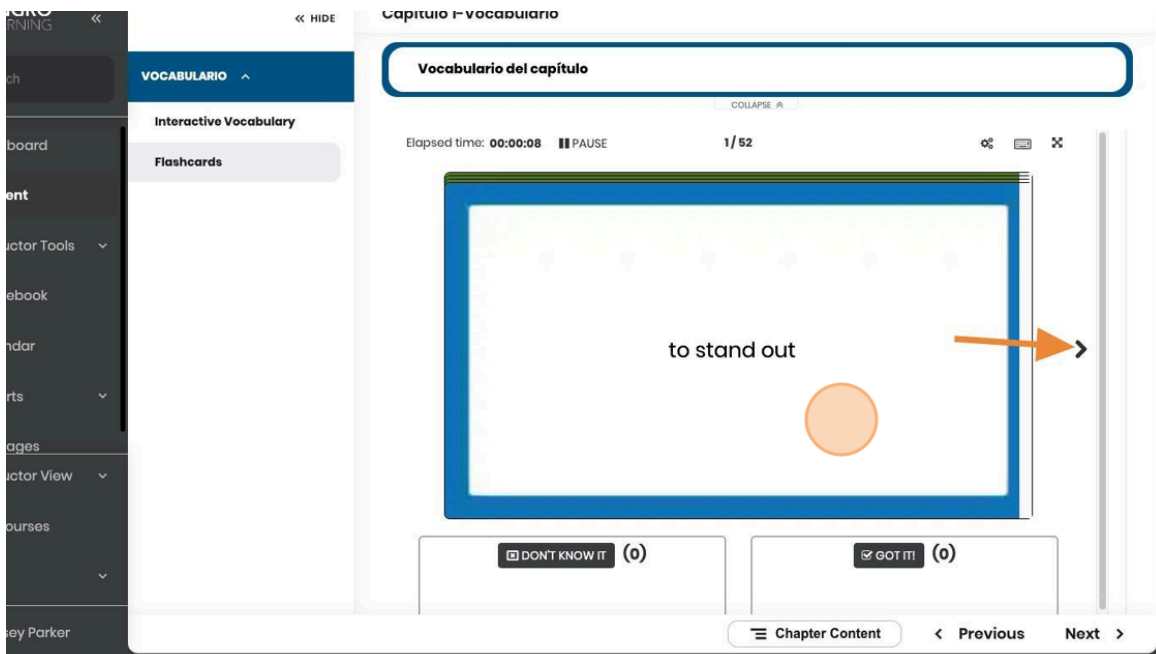


## STEP 2: Using the Flashcards

1. Students can simply **click anywhere** on the flashcard to flip it and see the answer.



2. If they want to **return to the front side with the vocabulary term**, they simply click anywhere on the flashcard again. Then, they can click on the **"next arrow"** on the right side to continue to the next flashcard.



## STEP 4: Explore the Flashcard Features

1. Students can use the **Elapsed Time** to have timed study sessions. They can use the **PAUSE** button to pause the time.
2. There is **AUDIO\*** of all vocabulary terms in the target language for students to practice pronunciation and listening comprehension. (\*For most titles, the audio is included in the Vocabulary Interactives, not the Flashcards.)
3. Students can **sort the flashcards** into **DON'T KNOW IT** or **GOT IT** to track their level of understanding. They simply click on either category and the flashcard will be sorted accordingly.
4. There are other features in the top right corner including:

**Settings** - students can toggle between the program-created flashcards, their own cards, and the create-your-own flashcards studio.

**Keyboard shortcuts**- this displays the various keyboard shortcuts available to help students easily navigate the flashcards using their keyboard.

**Full screen toggle** allow them to view the flashcards in full screen mode (also useful for in-class projection).



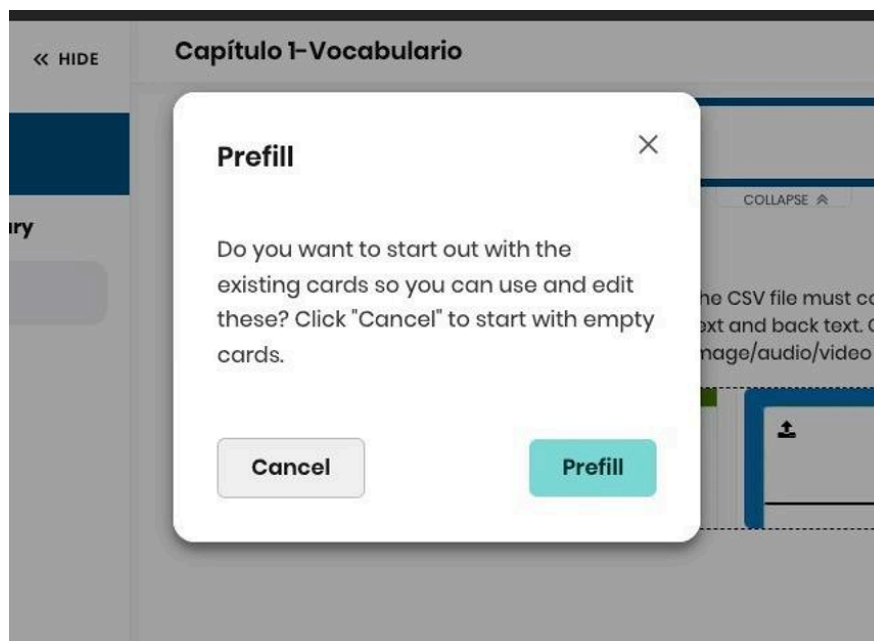
## STEP 4: Create your own Flashcards

Instructors can also make their own Flashcard sets.

1. Click on the **Settings** gear icon in the upper right corner. Then click **MAKE MY OWN CARDS**.

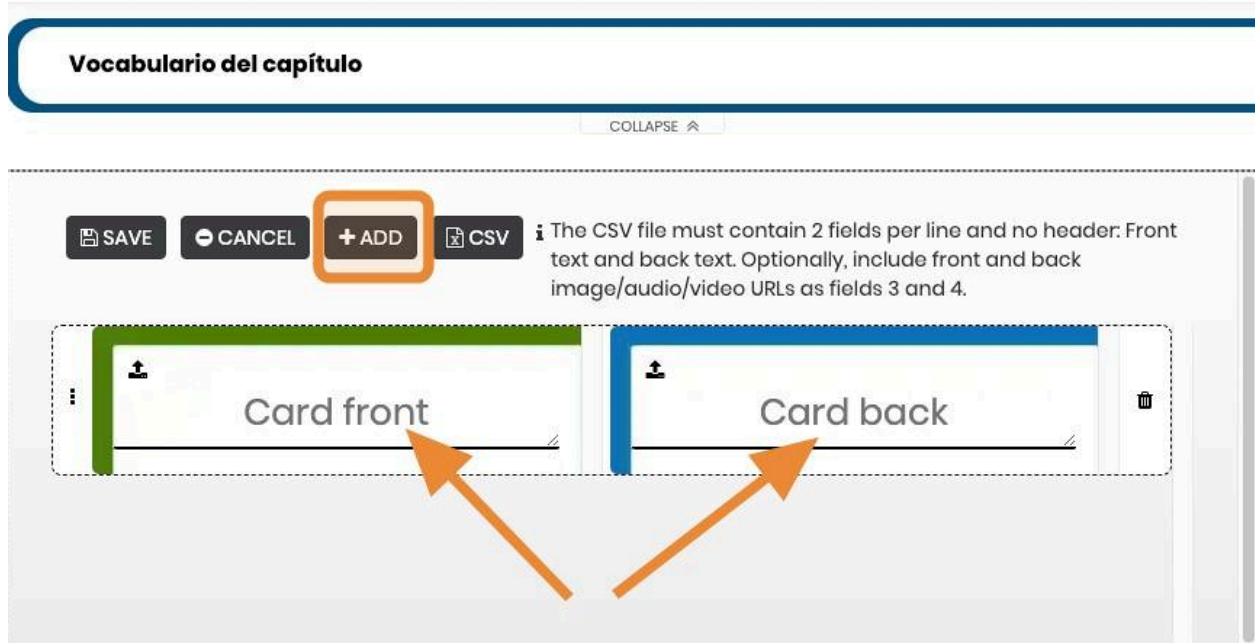


2. The new window will prompt you to either start out with the existing flashcards (Prefill) or start with an empty set (Cancel).



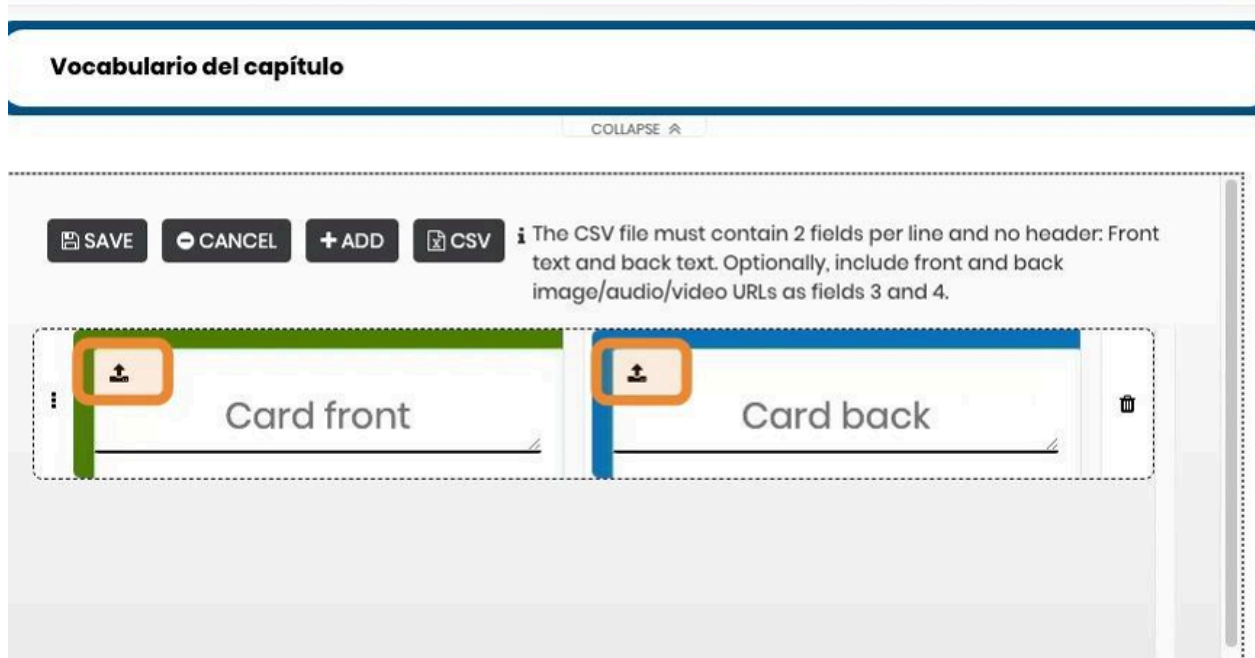
3. Start creating your Flashcards by typing in the **Card front** and **Card back** text areas. Then, click **+ADD** to add another flashcard.

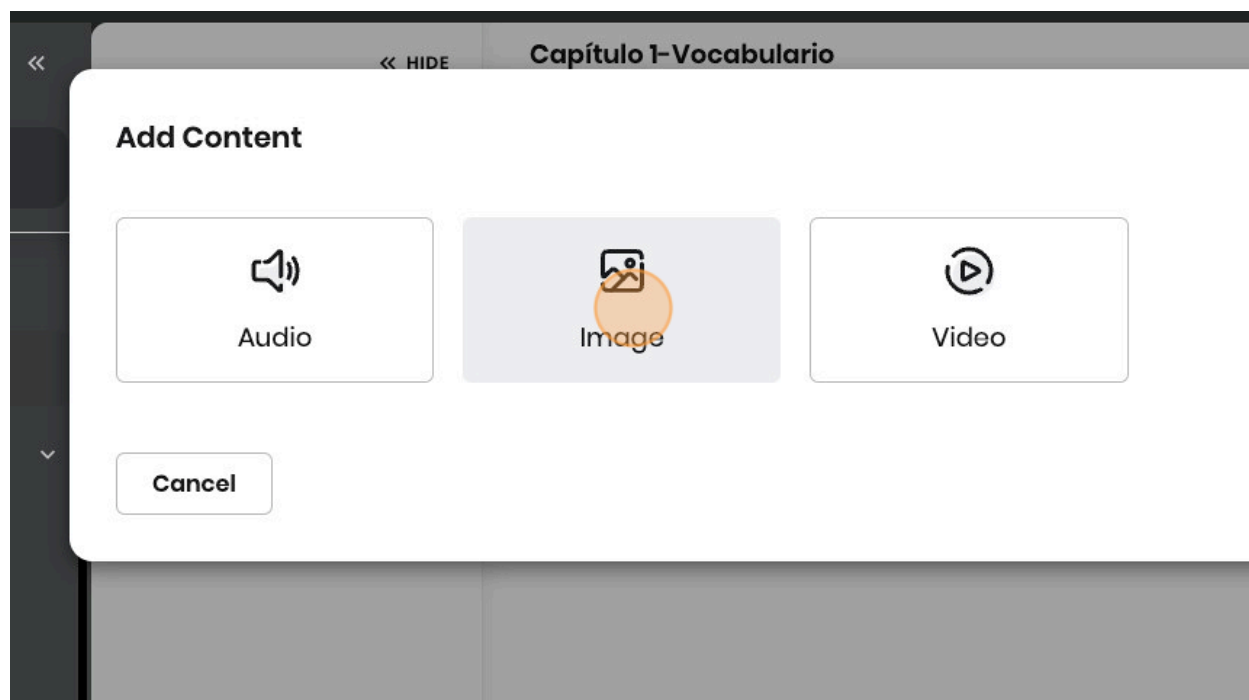


**OPTIONAL:** You can also add media to your flashcards by clicking on the upload icon in the top left corner of the flashcards.

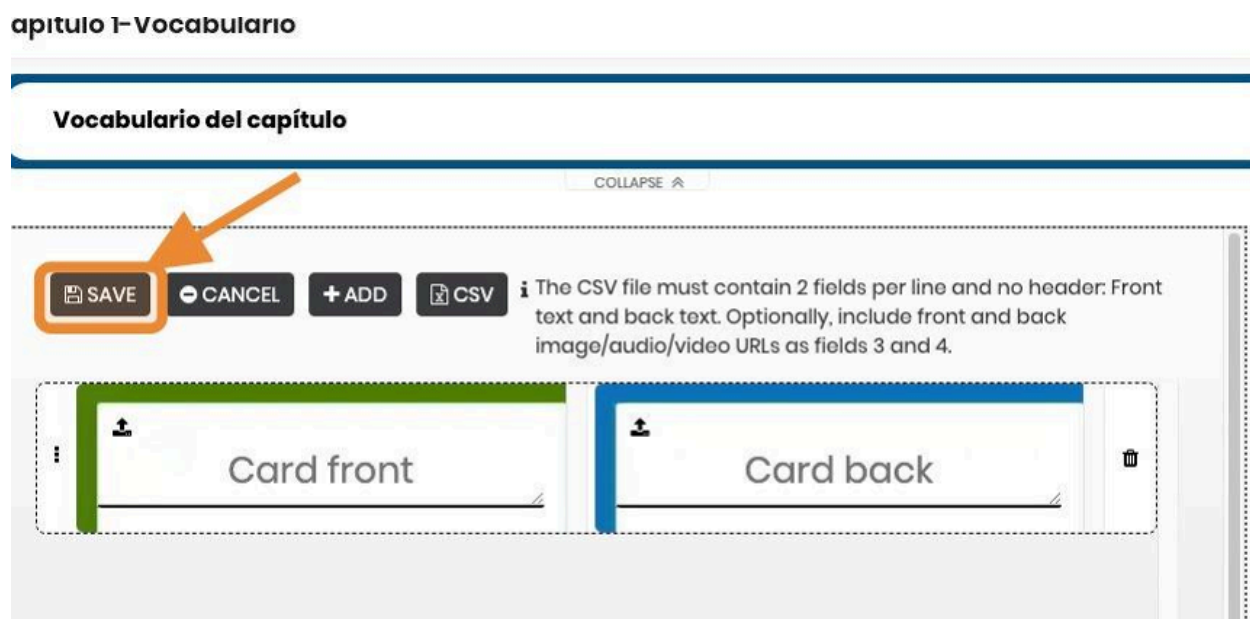
